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**Thompson School District** – The Thompson School District is the 16<sup>th</sup> largest school district in Colorado. District enrollment for the 2017-2018 school year is just over 16,000 students. Our district includes the cities of Loveland, Berthoud and the southern part of Fort Collins. We are a pre-k through 12<sup>th</sup> grade district comprised of twelve early-childhood centers, 19 elementary schools, five middle schools, one k-8 school, five high schools and two charter schools. Thompson schools state assessment scores are consistently above state averages; we concentrate on the whole child, accentuated by our four pillars: Math and Literacy, Creative and Critical Thinking, Safety and Belonging, and School to Life.

### Extended Learning Opportunities

Vocational courses and technical training are offered through Front Range Community College (F.R.C.C.), a cooperative effort of several area school districts, for 2-3 hours per day. Concurrent Enrollment offered through F.R.C.C. and AIMS Community College. ASCENT opportunities for seniors with 12 college credits.

### Advanced Placement/Pre-AP Program

In addition to AP courses, Mountain View offers Pre-AP courses within core content areas. Students receive weighted grades in AP courses. Students have the opportunity to go to any district high school for AP classes. In May 2017, 305 AP exams were completed. Of those, 50% received a score of three or higher.
