Year 3 school-year work schedule: 32 or more hours per week. You will be 16 years or older before June 2020 and will be a high school junior or senior in the 2020-21 school year.

What You Will Do:

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Practice safe work practices and understanding of PPE
- Performs skilled or semi-skilled painting, fencing, hardware installation, cement work, and related trades work.
- Lubricates equipment, change filters, clean equipment as directed and assist skilled workers in more difficult repairs.
- Learn basic knowledge of electrical systems and use of electrical test equipment.
- Assist HVAC Staff with tasks and other related duties.
- Perform selected demolition of materials under supervision.
- Perform basic carpentry work under direction of Carpenter team.
- Assist in the hanging of doors.
- Assist in the pouring of concrete.
- Assist in the install drop ceilings
- Other duties as assigned.

May also have exposure to working with Project Manager in the development and completion of projects that vary in size and complexity in the district – related to **the construction industry**.

- Track the progress and quality of project work through site visits and reporting
- Monitor architect and contractor compliance to contract documents
- Communicate relevant project information to the project team
- Keep the Project Manager (PM) informed about project status and issues that may impact client relations, budget, or schedule
- Evaluate construction schedules

What You Have Done:

- Applicants should be able to communicate clearly and concisely, both verbally and in writing.
- Applicants should also be on track to master the following arithmetic competencies by the beginning of the apprenticeship in order to access potential college-level training content (as outlined in College Board Accuplacer Program Manual, October 2016): perform the basic arithmetic operations of addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division using whole numbers, fractions, decimals, and mixed numbers make conversions among fractions, decimals, and percentages.

Coursework and Certifications:

Coursework and Certifications

This employer has committed to investing \$5,500 total toward each apprentice's education. They have allocated \$1,500 toward industry certification(s) and related training in apprenticeship Years 1 and 2. They have allocated \$4,000 toward higher education coursework in apprenticeship Year 3.

Industry Certification

Maintenance Technician apprentices will pursue the MSSC Certified Production Technician industry certification in apprenticeship Years 1 and 2. This certification has four modules: Safety, Quality, Production, and Maintenance. For each module, apprentices will take online coursework, receive instructional support from a CareerWise tutor, and then take a multiple choice exam. The time commitment for each module is approximately 20 hours. This certification is important for two reasons. First, it gives the apprentice the foundational skills, knowledge, and terminology to be successful. Second, the certification is a great addition to the apprentice's resume. Other Facility Management Certifications may be substituted as well.
